Department Heads present included Matt Keslar for Dwane Pacheco, Rick Beckwith, Steve Horton, Paul Kauchich, Dave Lansang, Matthew McBurnett, Kara Beech, and Jim Wamsley. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Approval of Minutes

Moved by Councilor Mosbey seconded by Councilor Wendorf to approve the City Council Meeting Minutes of August 21, 2018. Motion carried unanimously.

Presentation: Dominic Apodaca, Mission 22

Mayor Demshar informed the Council that Mr. Apodaca was unable to attend tonight.

Proclamation: Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

Mayor Demshar read a proclamation to declare September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, and encouraged citizens to Go Gold in the hopes of increasing the attention and dedication given to the Gold Ribbon and to the fight against childhood cancer.

Proclamation: Diaper Need Awareness Week

Mayor Demshar read a proclamation to declare the week of September 24 through 30, 2018, as Diaper Need Awareness Week, and encouraged citizens to donate generously to diaper banks, diaper drives, and those organizations that distribute diapers to families in need to help alleviate diaper need in Rock Springs.

Presentation: Anita McLaughin, Wyoming Community Foundation

Anita McLaughin with the Wyoming Community Foundation addressed the Council and stated that 2019 will be the Wyoming Community Foundation's 30th anniversary, and the Rock Springs area local board was incepted in 1991 and since that time, have granted over \$451,000 to this community. A few local community leaders are on this board, including Jack Costantino, Debbie Baker, Keith Hay, Paula Wonnacott, and Lauren Schoenfeld. The local board in Rock Springs has allocated grant monies in an approximate amount of \$80,000, including \$25,000 that was awarded to CLIMB Wyoming by a private donor. Ms. McLaughlin also stressed that one of their goals is to provide grant money to areas on our community where there are parks, or children at play. She provided Annual Reports from the Wyoming Community Foundation for the Council to review as well.

Councilor Halter added that the Joint Powers Telecom Board, of which he is the Council Liaison and Chairman, has opened up communication with the Wyoming Business Council's new Broadband Advisory Board, where they plan to express the needs in our area for broadband. Sublette County is looking expand services and is using Sweetwater County as a model. Discussions have begun to add them as a third entity to the Joint Powers Telecommunication Board.

Councilor Mosbey thanked Jennifer Messer, Museum Coordinator and staff at City Hall for their assistance in submitting Historical Museum Board Minutes from past years for approval and inclusion in the Historical Museum Board's records.

Moved by Councilor Halter, seconded by Councilor Mosbey to approve the Council Committee and Board Reports and place them on file. Motion carried unanimously.

Proclamation

WHEREAS, the City of Rock Springs is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting Rock Springs. Fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

WHEREAS, home fires killed 2,735 people in the United States in 2016, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and fire departments in the United States responded to 352,000 home fires; and

WHEREAS, the majority of U.S. fire deaths (4 out of 5) occur at home each year, and the fire death rate per 1,000 home fires reported to U.S. fire departments was 10 percent higher in 2016 than in 1980; and

WHEREAS, Rock Springs residents should identify places in their home where fires can start and eliminate those hazards; and

WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half, and Rock Springs residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and

WHEREAS, Rock Springs residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will, therefore, be more likely to survive a fire. Residents should listen for the sound of the smoke alarm and when it sounds, respond by going outside immediately to the designated meeting place; and

WHEREAS, Rock Springs first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education. The residents of Rock Springs are responsive to public education measures and are able to take action to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Look. Listen. Learn. Be aware – fire can happen anywhere™" effectively serves to remind us that we need to take personal steps to increase our safety from fire.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved, that I, Carl R. Demshar, Jr., Mayor of the City of Rock Springs, do hereby declare the week of **September 24** through **28**, **2018** as:

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

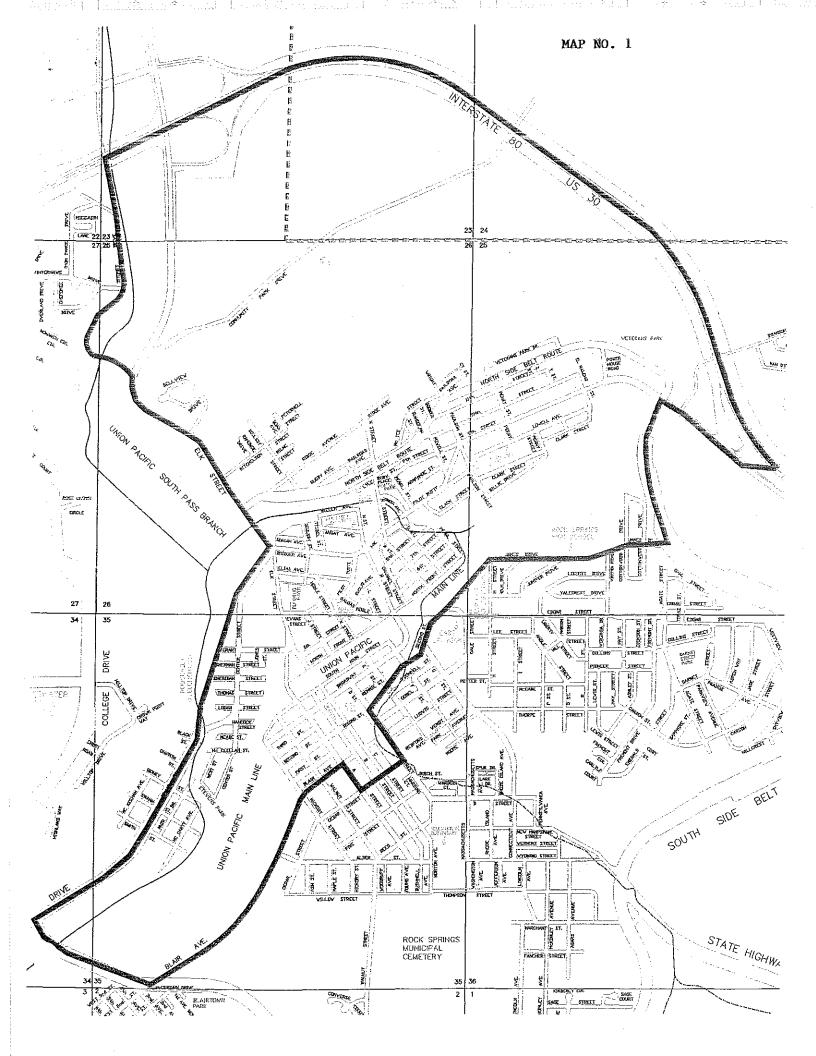

Thence on the northeasterly boundary of said City of Rock Springs parcel (1066/1756) and on the northeasterly boundary of a parcel of land conveyed to the City of Rock Springs by that deed of record in said office in Book 1125 on Page 289 - N 76° 14' 48"W (Record: N 76° 03' W) for a distance of 65.05 feet to the most northerly corner of said City of Rock Springs parcel (1125/289);

Thence N 20° 49' 48" E for a distance of 39.70 feet to the most southerly corner of a parcel of land conveyed to the City of Rock Springs by that deed of record in said office in Book 652 on Page 393;

Thence on the southeasterly boundary of said City of Rock Springs parcel (652/393) and on the southeasterly boundary of Block 5 of said North Addition - N 32° 12' 00" E for a distance of 130.42 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Said parcel contains an area of 46,824.8 SqFt or 1.075 Acres, more or less.

The base bearing for the above parcel is referred the official plat of said North Addition to the City of Rock Springs as filed for record on Page 37 - Book of Plats in the Office of the Sweetwater County Clerk and Recorder.
