#### **Request from the Finance Department for permission to dispose of surplus property**

Moved by Councilor Shalata, seconded by Councilor Halter to approve the request. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Request from the Rock Springs Main Street/URA to allow open containers during the Main</u> <u>Street Market on the South Main block from Bank Court to C Street, every Thursday from 4</u> p.m.—7 p.m. beginning on July 9, 2020, and ending on September 10, 2020

Mayor Kaumo deferred to Councilor Tate regarding the open container permit that has been requested. Councilor Tate stated that other communities are passing open container allowances for whole blocks, whole cities, etc. Most of these communities started with allowing open containers during their farmer's markets, as well as allowing sales of alcohol at farmer's markets. Mayor Kaumo also asked for Chief Pacheco's input on the request. Chief Pacheco stated that an email was submitted to the Governing Body and to the URA Board. He is not opposed to the request, but the request is too broad and must be dialed down to a certain location. The request lists the location to be South Main, from Bank Court to C Street, and that open container is the only detail requested, which can allow for not just malt beverages, but also spirituous liquors. Chief Pacheco added that that this could mean that pedestrians, traffic, and open containers would be present all in one place. Square State Brewing is the only place in the area that sells micro brewed beverage, and this would require sealed containers such as growlers being provided to be taken outside. Best practices are not outlined in the request, such as using ID scanners or a controlled area being provided for consumption and distribution. With this type of event, he pictures these best practices being put in place. Chief Pacheco sees the Farmer's Market as a family event, and he worries that it will bring different types of people and will send the wrong message for those who see the farmer's market as a family event. The main issue that he sees, though, is that it is not a controlled request. If vendors were brought in, it would be a more controlled atmosphere. If Square State were to extend their serving area, it would restrict it to 21 and over and would make more sense. Councilor Shalata asked whether Mr. Banks could come up with a solution to mediate this request. Mr. Banks stated that the URA's goal is to make downtown a vibrant and lively area. Lander recently approved a city-wide open container permit for the 4th of July. The whole idea is to enhance the whole experience, by encouraging people to stay downtown longer; perhaps they will eat at the Bitter Creek Brewery or at some other place, etc. Discussion took place regarding how open containers would affect this family event. Chief Pacheco asked that the Governing Body put some guidelines on the request, because if officers are called to the area, there will not be much that can be done. Mr. Beckwith read the ordinance regarding open containers, clarifying that the ordinance gives the Police and Fire Chiefs much authority, and that it also gives authority to the Governing Body to regulate the request – as such, any restrictions can be added by the Governing Body to the open container requests, but those restrictions must be approved by the Police and Fire Chief. Mayor Kaumo asked Chief Pacheco for language recommendations. Mr. Pacheco stated that he would like to see best practice language added and followed in the request, such as ID scanners, etc. He added that an active roadway is present, so safety must be addressed also. Alternative options were discussed. Councilor Zotti added that some of the alternatives are defeating the whole purpose, to visit vendors while enjoying beverages. Councilor Shalata stated that he is willing to table the request in order to find a compromise that will fit the event. Councilor West asked about the event dates, and asked whether they tried a trial run to allow for two trial weeks with malt beverages only, and then forego the request after two trial weeks or extend it, if it works. Mr. Banks stated that he was considering asking to amend the request. Mayor Kaumo also stated that the road being open does seem hazardous regardless, but, merchants will complain that the road to their business is being blocked if it should be closed. He supports Chief Pacheco and is hoping to find a happy medium.

Moved by Councilor West, seconded by Councilor Shalata to amend the request to include two dates of July 9 and 16, 2020, and allow malt beverages only. Motion carried with Councilor Savage voting no.

Councilor Savage asked whether the open container is being replaced with Malt Beverage, and clarification was provided that the open container can only be a malt beverage, for the dates of July 9 and July 16. This information was confirmed.

Moved by Councilor West, seconded by Councilor Shalata to approve the amended request. Motion carried with Councilor Savage voting no.
