Kaumo called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Members present included Councilors David Halter, Keaton West, Rob Zotti, Billy Shalata, Jeannie Demas, David Tate, and Tim Savage. Councilor Glennise Wendorf was absent from the meeting. Department Heads present included Matthew L. McBurnett, Paul Kauchich, Rick Beckwith, and Dwane Pacheco. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Approval of Revised Agenda

Moved by Councilor Shalata, seconded by Councilor Tate to approve the Revised Agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

APPOINTMENTS

Planning & Zoning Commission—Justin Lemon, 1st Term

Moved by Councilor West, seconded by Councilor Tate to reappoint Justin Lemon to the Planning & Zoning Commission for a first term. Upon roll call the following voted in favor: Councilors Halter, West, Zotti, Shalata, Savage, Demas, and Tate. Motion carried unanimously.

Rock Springs Historical Museum Board—Zoanne Henderson, 1st Term

Moved by Councilor Halter, seconded by Councilor Tate to appoint Zoanne Henderson to the Rock Springs Historical Museum Board for a first term. Upon roll call the following voted in favor: Councilors Halter, West, Zotti, Shalata, Savage, Demas, and Tate. Motion carried unanimously.

PRESENTATIONS & PROCLAMATIONS

Covid-19 (Coronavirus) Information—Kim Lionberger, Director, and Carla Roich, Public Health Response Coordinator for the Sweetwater County Public Health Department

Mayor Kaumo stated that the community wants to hear what direction we, as City leaders, should take regarding this sickness. Kim Lionberger gave worldwide update numbers, United States numbers, and state of Wyoming numbers. Currently there are 92,818 cases of Covid 19 globally, and 3,915 deaths have been recorded worldwide. There are 118 active cases in the United States. There are currently no cases of Covid-19 in the state of Wyoming. Travelers are being monitored closely when they return from certain countries. The State of Wyoming Department of Health is working closely with the Center for Disease Control and is keeping up-to-date with current guidelines to prevent the disease. The Office of Homeland Security is also keeping track of the current guidelines, who to notify of a positive Covid-19 case in our area, and more. They encouraged that the City have its own pandemic plan in place, with regard to operations such as absenteeism, janitorial services, etc. The same precautions should be taking place as with the seasonal flu. Mayor Kaumo asked about statistics relating to the seasonal flu, compared to Covid-19. The Denver International Airport would be the one checking those who fly into Rock Springs. Quarantines are only taking place at international airports. Councilor Shalata asked if testing kits are available to doctors locally, and Ms. Lionberger stated that kits were dispensed to the States, and the State of Wyoming health lab was doing its quality controls on the kits to be sure that they are ready for distribution. The testing will be done at the Wyoming Department of Health Lab, but options to distribute to hospitals are being considered. Councilor Shalata asked that if an outbreak were to take place, whether there would be enough beds to accommodate quarantined individuals. Mayor Kaumo stated that he does believe the Hospital has confirmed that there would be enough beds for a quarantine situation. Main components to prevent the spread of disease are to avoid contact if possible, wash your hands, and avoid touching your face. The Public Health Department suggested that the City be prepared for exposed workers, with public safety being a main component of the function of the City. The Fire Department has been given EMS guidelines from the CDC's information for transporting patients. Mayor Kaumo stated that with regard to masks, there have been articles that say for people to stop purchasing masks, as they don't prevent people from getting the disease. Public Health officials confirmed that masks will not prevent people from getting the disease; they are for those who are already

showing symptoms. He added that cleanliness is paramount to containing the disease and possibly keeping it out of Wyoming. Councilor Savage asked about verifying numbers of who has been hospitalized and who has actually been tested, and Ms. Lionberger confirmed that the numbers are actually higher, considering unreported cases. China has the test kits, and they were limited to that area at first, but have since become more available. Diagnoses were also made by observing symptoms and negative influenza tests. Councilor Shalata asked about the most vulnerable age groups and whether a pre-existing illness causes death. Only one child has been reported to have the disease worldwide. A recent H1N1 pandemic was recovered from fairly quickly, so this is not a situation to warrant panic. The question came up regarding creating a vaccine for the illness. Vaccines are developed by defining the molecular structure of the virus and testing to see what works to destroy the virus and what doesn't. Creating a vaccine is a long process. Viruses will mutate and can change, which can make vaccinations even more difficult to develop.

PETITIONS

Fred Von Ahrens gave an update on the Genesis Alkali expansion, explaining that it is coming along quickly and the foundations are over 5 feet in thickness. They are currently 2 weeks ahead of time. Mayor Kaumo looks forward to the progress and stated that the community is in need of this expansion.

Mayor Kaumo stated that with the highways being closed 54 times over the last couple of months and the recent pileup that took place, the question has come up from the Joint Powers Water Board regarding how long water reserves would last if chlorine ships were to not be received for treatment. The Joint Powers Water Board stores a large amount of chlorine to treat our water. Should chlorine shipments not be received, operations would continue for about a month to a month and a half.

Specific Purpose Tax Revised Priority List—Request & Discussion

Councilor West stated that he attended the Board of County Commissioners' meeting this morning, and that they awarded the City an additional \$360,000 to complete its sponsorship projects. The next matter is determining how to place the projects on the ballot, and bonding. Commissioner Schoenfeld is planning on organizing a workshop to discuss this at the end of the month. A contract was signed today by the Commissioners for underwriting services for bonding. Councilor West added that the Governing Body will need to decide soon on bonding and reminded everyone that a vote was taken in the past. Mayor Kaumo stated that he believes

the process of bonding will be helpful to campaign the projects, and that he is in support of it. He thanked Councilor West for obtaining the additional \$360,000.

Ward IV Town Hall Meeting—March 11, 2020 at the Broadway Theatre

Councilor West stated that a Town Hall event will be hosted on March 11 from 5:30—7 p.m. at the Broadway Theater, to provide an opportunity to get some feedback from constituents in the ward and to see what they would like to see accomplished next year with budget requests and Council initiatives being requested from the Finance Department. Mayor Kaumo stated that getting feedback regarding what is needed from the wards is a great idea and happens at a good time, during budget discussions.

Mayor Kaumo added that sales tax numbers were received for January 2020, and the amount was 38% lower than what was received in March of 2019. Contracts are in the midst of negotiation for budgets and union contracts, and that the City is hoping that this is not a trend.

Moved by Councilor Shalata, seconded by Councilor Zotti to approve the Council Committee and Board Reports and place them on file. Motion carried unanimously.
