PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS

Rock Springs Main Street Certificate Presentation—Jenn Ford, Member of the Wyoming Main Street Advisory Board

Jenn Ford, Wyoming Main Street Advisory Board Member, is proud to be here to present an award to the Rock Springs Main Street. Main Street America is a large organization; Rock Springs Main Street has been designated as a 2020 Accredited Program. The Accreditation program is a top tier of recognition and effort to honor Main Street principles. The Rock Springs City Council will also be presented a certificate of appreciation, which is not physically present at this time. Main Street successes are not possible without local government support. Ms. Ford added that the Wyoming Main Street Advisory Board is excited to present awards to the Rock Springs Main Street and the City Council tonight.

Suicide in Sweetwater County—Shelby Gordon and Delaney Wells, Sweetwater County Prevention Coalition

Delaney Wells and Shelby Gordon, members of the Sweetwater County Prevention Coalition, and Southwest Counseling Services presented suicide statistics, along with prevention strategies and resources offered. Statistics include rural areas being underreported for suicides by 300%, suicide rates have increased by 34%, and the highest rates are in age groups of males over 75 and 40-44 years of age. It is estimated that 1 of 4 young adults has seriously considered suicide in the last 30 days. 82% of youth suicides in Wyoming were done with a firearm owned by a family

member. Prevention strategies discussed included both community levels and individual levels. Community prevention strategies include enforcing gun locks, medicine bottle locks, and spreading awareness. Individual prevention strategies include looking for warning signs, checking in with family and friends, asking questions, and encouraging those in your life to seek help. The first Monday of the month, a suicide support and bereavement group meets at the Community Fine Arts Center at 6 p.m. A belief that has been proven to be a myth is discussing suicide in particular with a person who may be at risk – it does not increase a person’s likelihood of dying by suicide. The Coalition is hoping to decrease suicide rates by implementing community programs, providing training, taking safety measures, and holding community groups. A peer-to-peer support group called the Hope Squad has been implemented in Green River to encourage those who are having suicidal ideations by helping them get through it. Phone numbers to call include Southwest Counseling at 307-352-6677, even after hours, to get in contact with a clinician if support is needed when offices are closed. Mayor Kaumo spoke with Chief Pacheco regarding the increase in suicide rates over the past year, and what it looks like when someone shows no signs or is not aware of the multitude of resources available to them if they are having these thoughts. He also asked about a statistic shown that suicide rates are highest for the Construction & Extraction profession at a rate of 52.1 suicide deaths per 100,000 people. Ms. Gordon stated that it is an issue culturally, as well as having stress as an attributing factor for this particular industry. A stigma is present and isolation can also play a part. Many resources are also available for free to the community such as gun locks, pill bottle locks, and medicine lock boxes; just contact the Coalition to get any of those items if they are needed.

Resolution from the Missouri Valley Division of the International Association of Fire Chiefs in Appreciation of Law Enforcement—Jim Wamsley, Rock Springs Fire Department

Chief Jim Wamsley of the Missouri Valley Division of the International Association of Fire Chiefs stated that the annual conference was held virtually in August, and much discussion was had regarding looking out for their brothers and sisters in law enforcement. Tonight, the Rock Springs Fire Department is here to thank their law enforcement counterparts for looking out for their community. Resolution number 3 was read from the Missouri Valley Division of the International Association of Fire Chiefs. Mayor Kaumo stated that he sees these departments working together day in and day out, and everyone gets together during emergency situations or during events like the 9/11 ceremony that was held just last week. He is grateful for the Resolution passed, and it is clear that the two must work together, and do just that, in a very effective way. Chief Wamsley presented the Resolution to Chief Dwane Pacheco of the Rock Springs Police Department.
