**PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS**

**Arbor Day—May 21, 2021**

Mayor Kaumo stated that despite budget concerns, maintaining our tree population is always important. Mark Lyon, Parks Superintendent, announced that this Friday, May 21, 2021, at 10 a.m. a tree planting ceremony will take place at the High Desert Arboretum to honor Arbor Day. Mr. Lyon intends to maintain the Tree City USA status, and even in our climate with tree growth being difficult, the City of Rock Springs manages to keep the tree population strong. Some replacements at the arboretum, as well as on the green belts, will be taking place this summer. Mayor Kaumo proclaimed May 21, 2021 as Arbor Day in the City of Rock Springs, and urged all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodland. He also urged all citizens to plant trees to gladden the heart and promote the well-being of this, and future, generations.

Jay Schneider, owner of Get n' Go Convenience Stores, stated that just 10.5 years ago he was in front of this City Council asking for a transfer of these same retail licenses from the Bunning family, and now he is here tonight to ask for transfer of the same licenses to CF Altitude, LLC. Dennis Dirkse addressed the Governing Body on behalf of CF Altitude, LLC to provide background information on the company. He stated that he has educated himself on the procedures of alcohol sales in our state, as these are the first stores that CF Altitude LLC will be opening in Wyoming. Company procedures for alcohol sales were summarized. Mayor Kaumo welcomed Mr. Dirkse and CF Altitude, LLC to the community and added that he is looking forward to working together. Chief Pacheco stated that the Rock Springs Police Department does offer TIPS training free of charge, and that the department appreciates the procedures that will be put into place to practice safe alcohol distribution.

## **COUNCIL COMMITTEE AND BOARD REPORTS**

### **Sweetwater County Intergovernmental Joint Leadership Group Minutes of April 7, 2021**

Councilor West stated that he attended the Sweetwater Board of County Commissioner's meeting today. A cap amount was decided for the upcoming tax initiative for \$90 million, and that it should take approximately 7 years to pay that amount off. The County themselves will receive 20%, or \$18 million, Rock Springs will receive 46%, or \$41.4 million, Green River will receive 26.5%, or \$23.85 million, Wamsutter will receive 2.25%, or \$2.5 million, Superior will receive 2%, or \$1.8 million, and Granger and Bairoil will receive 1.5%, or \$1.35 million each. Councilor West added that the length is longer than the City would have liked, but he is glad to see that the Commissioners took some direction. Now it is a matter of deciding how the City would like to move forward. Revenue is at an all-time low, so if sales tax revenues turn around for the better, the length of the tax may end up being shorter. Mayor Kaumo stated that now that we have a defined cap to work with, that he would like to get back together in the near future to decide on a project list and move forward from here. He thanked the Board of County Commissioners for allowing our communities to plan by establishing the cap so quickly.

Moved by Councilor Zotti, seconded by Councilor Robinson to approve the Council Committee and Board Reports and place them on file. Motion carried unanimously.
