City Council met in regular session on August 17, 2021. Mayor Timothy A. Kaumo called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Members present included Councilors Larry Hickerson, Keaton West, Brent Bettolo, David Halter, Rob Zotti, Jeannie Demas, and Tim Savage. Councilor Tim Robinson was absent from the meeting. Department Heads present included Dwane Pacheco, Jim Wamsley, Rick Beckwith, Matthew L. McBurnett, Dave Lansang, and Paul Kauchich. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Approval of Minutes

Moved by Councilor West, seconded by Councilor Bettolo to approve the City Council Meeting Minutes of August 3, 2021. Motion carried unanimously.

APPOINTMENTS

Parks & Recreation Advisory Board—Darcie Punches-Mickelson, 3rd Term

Moved by Councilor Hickerson, seconded by Councilor Bettolo to approve the appointment of Darcie Punches-Mickelson to a third term on the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board. Upon roll call, the following voted in favor: Councilors Hickerson, West, Bettolo, Halter, Zotti, Demas, and Savage. Motion carried unanimously.

Urban Renewal Agency Commission—Kevin Harper, 2nd Term

Moved by Councilor Bettolo, seconded by Councilor Hickerson to approve the appointment of Kevin Harper to a second term on the Urban Renewal Agency Commission. Upon roll call, the following voted in favor: Councilors Hickerson, West, Bettolo, Halter, Zotti, Demas, and Savage. Motion carried unanimously.

PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS

Rob Miller and Kelly Mathis with the Rock Springs Fire Department, and Clark Allred with the SWCO Fire District 1, discussed 9-11 events coming up. The events from 9-11-2001 were recounted. In New York City alone, 297 victims were killed in the 9-11 attacks. Statistics from emergency responders who were sent to ground zero were given. A stair climb, which will closely replicate the 110 floors of the World Trade Center, is a tradition of emergency responders to honor the lives saved and lost. Clark Allred added that these events have been organized in partnership with Fire District 1, City of Rock Springs, WWCC, RSHS, as well as many businesses who have donated money, time, and goods, to honor those events in 2001. The stair climb will be replaced with a walk up and down Grant Street. Some firefighters will be wearing full turnout gear, and other gear will be available to civilians so that they can understand the full weight of what the firefighters responding to the 9-11 attacks wore while climbing up 110 stories. Mr. Miller stated that at the circle of Western Wyoming Community College at 11 a.m., there will be a flag ceremony with speakers, and an open house will also be going on in the north parking lot for emergency responders to interact with members of the community. This is done by

donations of Western Wyoming Community College through the location, as well as by businesses throughout the community. Councilor Bettolo asked the new firefighter, Tristan, if he was going to be doing the climb in full turnout gear, to which he stated he would. Mayor Kaumo added that it is hard to believe that this event happened twenty years ago. Mr. Miller replied, stating that a third of Rock Springs' population had not even been born when this had happened. Mayor Kaumo stated that he remembers exactly what he was doing when this tragedy had taken place. It is unfortunate to see our leadership at the federal level in such a mess, because it means that we will be paying the price again, not before long. Mayor Kaumo then proclaimed September 11, 2021 as 9-11 Remembrance Day in the City of Rock Springs. He encouraged citizens to honor the lives of those lost through participation in the Rock Springs Fire Department's 9/11 Memorial Climb at 7 a.m. in the South Parking Lot at Western Wyoming Community College.

Councilor Zotti thanked Matthew L. McBurnett, City Clerk, for his work researching this. He feels it will be money well spent to guide the City through its next budget process with uncertain economic times coming in the near future.

Moved by Councilor Zotti, seconded by Councilor West to approve Resolution 2021-119. Upon roll call the following voted in favor: Councilors Hickerson, West, Bettolo, Halter, Zotti, Demas, Savage, and Mayor Kaumo. Motion carried unanimously.

Micro piles have been completed. The contractor has pulled off the project, so work will continue to be done by other contractors as well. The building is secure. The rental portion is not ready at this point, but work is continuing, as interior concrete floors will be poured soon. Councilor West asked if the new goal for an anchor tenant is sitting at December 2021 now, since December 2020 was not met. Mayor Kaumo stated that the marketing aspects are still under

review. There are a couple of fairly decent parties who are interested. The realtors want to hang banners on the outside of the building, but this is not feasible with the terra cotta work being done.

Mayor Kaumo stated that he noticed that there were concerns from the public regarding funding provided by the City to the airport, but this funding is not coming from the City—it will be awarded through grant funding obtained by the airport board and staff. The airport is used as a marketing tool for bringing businesses into the community.

Moved by Councilor West, seconded by Councilor Bettolo to approve Resolution 2021-121. Upon roll call the following voted in favor: Councilors Hickerson, West, Bettolo, Halter, Zotti, Demas, Savage, and Mayor Kaumo. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution 2021-122 A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND APPROVING A MAIN STREET FAÇADE IMPROVEMENT GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN NATIONAL MAIN STREET CENTER, A SUBSIDIARY OF THE TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION, AND THE CITY OF ROCK SPRINGS, AND AUTHORIZING TIMOTHY A. KAUMO, AS MAYOR OF THE CITY OF ROCK SPRINGS, WYOMING, TO EXECUTE SAID GRANT ON BEHALF OF SAID CITY , was read by title.
